Rules:

1. Bring 1 item from each of the plastics category (#1-#7) – See Below
2. Bring in 10 items that are paper products
3. Bring 1 or more E-Waste item (see E-Waste Flyer)

<p>#1 PETE Polyethylene Terephlate</p>	<p>Soft drink bottles, water bottles, plastic peanut butter and jam bottles and salad dressing bottles</p>
<p>#2 HDPE High Density Polyethylene</p>	<p>Plastic milk cartons, juice bottles, shampoo bottles, and liquid detergent containers, Hula Hoop rings, Five gallon buckets, milk, juice, grocery bags, toiletry bottles</p>
<p>#3 PVC Polyvinyl Chloride</p>	<p>Clear food packages, liquid detergent containers, and many construction applications including some traffic cones, rigid PVC piping and vinyl records</p>
<p>#4 LDPE Low-Density Polyethylene</p>	<p>Bread and frozen food bags, trash cans, and garbage can liners, squeezable bottles examples are honey, mustard or ketchup bottles and cling films</p>
<p>#5 PP Polypropylene</p>	<p>Reusable microwaveable ware; kitchenware; yogurt containers; margarine tubs; microwaveable disposable take-out containers; disposable cups; plates and medicine bottles</p>
<p>#6 PS Polystyrene</p>	<p>Packing foam, egg cartons; packing peanuts; disposable cups, plates, trays and cutlery; disposable take-out containers, CD cases</p>
<p>#7 Other</p>	<p>Headlight lenses and safety, prescription or sun glass lenses; baby bottles, compact discs, electronic housing, instrument panels</p>
