

R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS: The Commissioner of Indian Affairs, in his letter of September 14, 1939, to the Superintendent, called our attention to the fact that it would be inconvenient to transfer the salaries now paid from Tribal Funds to "Support of Indians", and that "Support of Indians" would not be the proper fund to charge these salaries to, and

WHEREAS: He advises that these salaries, if at all transferred, should be to "Agriculture Stockraising Among Indians," now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That the salaries in question remain as they have been in the past for the fiscal year involved, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That in the future arrangements be made to take care of these employees from other than Tribal Funds and that the Tribal Funds be conserved and used for tribal development such as Agriculture, livestock, range improvement, home building, relief of the needy, and such other activities and enterprises as will tend to more directly habilitate our people, relieve hardship and assist them in more firmly establishing themselves in permanent homes on farms within the reservation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the question of the use of Tribal Funds for salaries receive additional consideration and discussion before the next budget is compiled and presented for approval so that there may be more thorough understanding and amiable agreement as to who how many employees appointed by the Indian Office, without the approval or disapproval of the Tribal Council be paid from Tribal Funds.
