

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS: There has been under restoration one of the larger ruins now known as Kinisba and the same has been taken over and carried on as a CCC-ID project for the reservation and the same will be maintained by the Tribe for the time being as its historical and educational value for the Reservation and visiting people, now, therefore be it

RESOLVED that since Dr. Byron Cummings has promoted and taken the leading part in the restoration of this project, first, while head of the Department of Archeology of the State University, and since his retirement from that institution has continued to devote his time and energy to the project in the interest of Science and has directed the work since it has been taken over as a CCC-ID project and during the past six months while funds were available, has been employed as foreman and as it now becomes necessary to temporarily discontinue Dr. Cummings on a pay status and the restoration is practically complete, be it further

RESOLVED that Dr. Cummings be asked to remain in charge of the ruin until funds are available for the parking and the completion of minor details, or until other arrangements are made and funds available so he may again be employed on a pay status, and that he be assigned a laborer whom he has trained so that with this laborer he may complete unfinished details to the museum and restore and properly arrange the many artifacts collected during the restoration in the museum; and that for his services as caretaker of the property he be allowed free-of-charge, quarters, lights, heat and water, and that such expense for the maintenance of quarters, light, heat and water be borne by the Tribe, and be it further

RESOLVED: That the Council for the Tribe, express to Dr. Cummings their appreciation for the services rendered and the patience shown with Indian workers during the restoration; that the Council for and in behalf of the Tribe, express a desire to have Dr. Cummings remain at their ruin and complete all details as outlined and planned with the Superintendent of the Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was this 2d day of October, 1939 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Fort Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 1 (m) & (n), Article VI of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
