

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS Department is carrying on the Tribal Buying and Selling Enterprise has shown the need of several changes in the forms now used because they do not provide sufficient records to facilitate the handling of the enterprise business.

IT IS RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, under authority of its Constitution and By-laws hereby amends its resolution of March 6, 1939, that - -

- (1) Form 8, now in use known as the "Individual Ledger Account" be replaced with a new form No. 8 providing a better and more complete Individual Account record;
- (2) A form be provided for use in giving a receipt to persons making purchases in cash as well as for payments on their accounts, this form to be designated Form No. 8.
- (3) There also be added an unnumbered form to be known as "Deposit Receipt" This form should be used as a receipt from the person handling the enterprise business.
- (4) Form No. 1 "Application For Credit", the use of which was approved and required to be executed in triplicate, shall hereafter be prepared in duplicate inasmuch as two copies will be sufficient for all purposes.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED: That the resolution of March 6, 1939 as amended by resolution of September 21, 1939 and as hereby further amended to incorporate the changes indicated above, shall remain in full force and effect until a certified copy or copies of a duly amended resolution or resolutions recind or further amend the resolution as it now stands, have been furnished to the Secretary of the Interior.

The foregoing resolution was this 6th day of November 1939, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Fort Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 1 of Article VI of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe enacted by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 23, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (49 Stat. 364).

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Messrs. Louis A. Kuhne and A. B. Noel have located manganese and other minerals on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation and have made proper location filing with the County Recorder of Gila County and the Fort Apache Indian Agency, and desire to develop the mining properties, have made application for mining lease on six claims totaling 120 acres,

AND WHEREAS: The Tribal Council believes that in the interest of promoting reservation industries, the applicants should be given an opportunity to carry on mining operations to develop revenues for the Tribe if any exist;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe approve the lease of Messrs. Louis A. Kuhne and A. B. Noel in accordance with the authority vested by Section 1 (c), Article VI of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 18 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

The foregoing resolution was this 8th day of November 1939, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Fort Apache Tribe.
