

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS: Mr. J. R. McCorkel, of Showlow, Arizona has located a quantity of asbestos mineral on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation and has made proper location filing with the County Recorder of Gila County, Arizona, and filed a copy thereof with the Fort Apache Indian Agency, and desires to develop the mining prospect has made application for a Mining Lease on one Claim containing approximately 20 acres, and

WHEREAS: The Tribal Council believes that it is in the interest of the Tribe to promote and encourage reservation industries, the applicant for this mining lease should be given an opportunity to further develop his claim,

NOW THEREFOR BE IT RESOLVED: That the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session, approve the granting of a Mining Lease to Mr. A. J. McCorkel covering his claim in the Salt River Mining District, identified as the Hillside Mine and so recorded; in accordance with the authority vested by Section 1 (c), Article VI of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
