

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, an advertisement has been circulated for Grazing privileges on Range No. 16 of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation for a period of 2 years, during the Summer season from May 15, 1940 to October 15, 1940 and the same period in 1941, and a satisfactory bid has been received from Mr. John C. Hall.

NOW THEREFOR BE IT RESOLVED, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, that a Grazing Permit be and is hereby approved for grazing privileges as advertised, and that the Bid of John C. Hall be accepted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Agency is hereby authorized to enter into an Agreement with Mr. John C. Hall, and to collect lease moneys due and deposit such funds in the Treasury of the United States to the credit of the Tribal Account.

The foregoing resolution was this 3rd day of June 1940, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 1 (n), Article VI of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 14, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 28, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
