

R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS: The Tribal Council having before them applications for many more loans than it is possible to cover with our present revolving reimbursable tribal fund, and we feel many more of our people need homes, farm equipment, cattle, etc., and realize that in the purchase of homes, cattle and other items, long-time payments are necessary owing to small farms and low income.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED and recommended that \$50,000 additional of the tribal funds now in the Treasury of the United States as Proceeds of Labor, Fort Apache Indians, Industrial Assistance, Reimbursable, be appropriated for our use in the revolving credit fund in financing our people and it is urgently requested that the Indian Office include the above amount in the Indian Bill and foster the appropriation by Congress.

The foregoing resolution was on June 3, 1940 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (e) of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
