

R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, Many of the people living on and near dry farms in various sections of the reservation and domestic water supply is an acute problem and it is necessary to haul water for several miles or live near following streams which makes it impossible to build permanent homes on or near the land, and

WHEREAS, At the present time the reservation does not have adequate equipment for drilling family wells and no funds with which to buy such equipment and the CCC drilling equipment is too heavy and cumbersome, too expensive to move around and is not available for the drilling of community wells.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that \$5,000 from Individual Indian Money, White Mountain Apache Tribe, Account W-35, be made available for the purchase of a suitable machine for the construction of community and family wells so that our people may have a better and permanent domestic water supply near available land.

It is respectfully requested that the Indian Office approve and request the Secretary of the Interior to place to the credit of the Fort Apache Indian Agency the above amount at the earliest practical date so that a suitable machine may be purchased for the purpose outlined above.

The foregoing resolution was on June 3, 1940 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d) of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
