

R E S O L U T I O N

Be it resolved by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this date July 1, 1940 that:

In order to expedite and assist the Indian Department to improve the present tuberculosis situation within the Fort Apache Reservation (as recently reported by a survey of the Health Department) through the establishment of a sanatorium and such other means as the Department feels advisable and expedient, the Council hereby recommends and requests the Secretary of the Interior to place to the credit of the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, \$10,000 of tribal funds for the above purpose.

Be it further resolved and the Council recommends, that:

The Health Department through the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, set up an additional \$15,000 making a total of \$25,000 for the expenditure during the fiscal year 1941 for the remodeling, equipping and operation of a sanatorium in a suitable building here at Whiteriver for the above purposes.

The foregoing resolution was this 1st day of July 1940 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 1-d-g-e, Article VI of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
