

R E S O L U T I O N

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, in special session this date September 26, 1940 that:

WHEREAS, There has been under consideration for some time the desirability of carrying on a predatory animal control project for the purpose of taking predators that are causing damage to game and particularly to livestock, and

WHEREAS, there continue to be reports of depredation in several sections of the Reservation and it is the desire of the Tribal Council to eliminate the depredators by having them trapped or killed, now

THEREFOR BE IT RESOLVED, by the Tribal Council that we request approval of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs for carrying on predatory animal control on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, for such time as the need therefor is indicated by actual depredations. The termination of this work or project to be designated by the Commissioner of Indian Affairs in his letter of approval and authority to carry on the project.

The foregoing resolution was this 26th, day of September 1940, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 1 (n) , Article VI of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on August 14, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984).
