

R E S O L U T I O N

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache tribe of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, in regular session this 7th day of October, 1940, That:

WHEREAS, The Extension personnel has recommended to us the use of artificial insemination of our high grade Livestock, for breeding purposes, and

WHEREAS, it will require the construction of Breeding Corrals or pens to properly handle the stock during the breeding season at an estimated cost of \$2,000, now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Tribal Council that we request approval of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs to use \$2,000.00 of the funds allotted under the 1941 Budget Authority, from the appropriation "P.L. Fort Apache Indians Arizona, Support, 1941", for the employment of labor and purchase of materials and supplies necessary to construct the Corral, in the vicinity of the Reservation Ranch.

The foregoing resolution was this 7th day of October, 1940, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 1 (a), Article VI of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 14, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
