

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS The Tribal Council in regular session this 8th day of April, 1941, having duly considered the request of the Deputy Special Officer and his assistants, and being conversant with the extensive amount of police work and sympathetic to the request and needs for transportation not only for police work, but voluminous other duties such as transporting members of the tribe to and from court, especially Federal Court which is usually held in Prescott or Tucson, 250 miles distance from this Agency, and many other transportation problems not directly connected with police activities but still necessary .

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council approve the request of the Police Department for the purchase of an additional 3/4-ton pickup car at a cost of not to exceed \$1,000;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation request the Secretary of the Interior through the Indian Office to approve the expenditure of the above amount from Individual Indian Money, White Mountain Apache Tribal Account now on deposit to the credit of the Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on April 8, 1941, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (e) of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
