

R E S O L U T I O N

Be it resolved by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe
in regular session this date June 9, 1941

That the Secretary of the Interior be and is hereby requested to take jurisdiction of all cases of members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of Indians in the State of Arizona who die possessed of personal property, whether restricted or unrestricted, and through the Examiner of Inheritance to conduct hearings on the estates of such deceased Indians, determine their heirs in accordance with the laws of descent and distribution of the said State, and to approve or disapprove the wills of any such Indians who die testate.

The foregoing resolution was duly adopted this 9th day of June, 1941 by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Sec. 1, paragraph (a), Article VI, of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 14, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
