

RESOLUTION .

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular Session this date September 8, 1941, that:

WHEREAS, an application for mining Asbestos has been received from Gladys Baker and Charles Ireland, both of Globe, Arizona, supported by an Individual Surety Bond, together with advance rental fees, and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Council to promote mining activities on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation to the end that if minerals of value can be produced to provide additional tribal revenue, it will operate to the benefit of the Tribe financially, and

WHEREAS, the applicants have located mineral claims which they desire to develop, ~~now~~

NOW THEREFOR, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Tribal Council approve, and hereby does approve the granting of a Mining Lease to Gladys Baker and Charles Ireland, of Globe, Arizona, on five (5) mining claims, each containing 20 acres, and consisting of 100 acres in all, located in the County of Gila, and State of Arizona, within the boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, on unsurveyed lands.

The foregoing resolution was this 8th day of September, 1941, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to Authority vested in it by Section 1 (e), Article VI, of the Constitution and by-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, pursuant to Section 13 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (49 Stat. 984).
