

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this date September 9, 1942 that:

WHEREAS, two applications for mining Asbestos have been received from John A. Bacon of Globe, Arizona, supported by an Individual Surety Bond, together with advance rental and filing fee, and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Council to promote mining activities on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation to the end that if minerals of value can be produced to provide additional tribal revenue, it will operate to the benefit of the Tribe financially, and

WHEREAS, the applicant has located mineral claims which he desires to develop,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Tribal Council approve and hereby does approve the granting of mining leases to John A. Bacon of Globe, Arizona, on two (2) mining claims; one about three miles in a northwest direction from the Regal Asbestos Mines and about 3/4 mile up Salt Creek from Salt River and about 1/4 mile West of Fiber King Mine, in the Globe Mining District, named the Victory No. 1. The other claim, named Victory No. 4 is located in the same Globe Mining District, Gila County, about three miles in a northwest direction from Regal Asbestos Mines and joins the Fiber King Mine on the east. Each claim contains 20 acres.

The foregoing resolution was on September 9, 1942 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (c) of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
