

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF
THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

Be it resolved by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in special session this date February 13, 1943 that:

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe under date of March 9, 1942. passed Resolution No. 84 authorizing the advertisement of the Maverick Timber Unit, and

WHEREAS, under date of January 28, 1943, the Secretary, through the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, approved the advertising of the Maverick Timber Unit and submitted with his approval a form of Contract for the approval of the Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has had under consideration the form of Contract and included therein a section as to Indian preference in employment of labor, a section pertaining to housing facilities, and a section pertaining to logging plans over five-year periods.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Contract, as amended, be approved by the Commissioner of Indian Affairs and the Maverick Timber Unit advertised as of February 15, and that all bids of prospective purchasers be submitted to the Tribal Council for final approval when opened.

The foregoing resolution was on February 15, 1943 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (c) of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
