

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has conferred with the Superintendent in considerable detail on a post war plan as called for in an order from the Commissioner of Indian Affairs dated July 14, 1943, and

WHEREAS, the former council went into considerable detail with the supervisory staff in preparing this program,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this Council go on record as approving this plan and recommending its fulfillment over a period of years insofar as it humanely possible and as at time and conditions as to the need for the same justify.

The foregoing resolution was this 12th day of June, 1944 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 1 (a), and (b) of Article VI of the Constitution and By-laws of the tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
