

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this date, July 3, 1944, that:

The Badger Creek Timber Unit be advertised for sale to the highest bidder, provided that:

1. That portion of "General Timber Sales Regulations" concerning brush disposal, and in particular that portion thereof which requires cutting, piling and burning of all limbs four inches and under be strictly enforced by the Forest Officer in Charge.
2. Scenic and protection strips of timber be left on each side of all major truck-trails and along all streams reserving all except over-mature timber. Such strips to be not less than 100 feet wide and wider where necessary.
3. Any or all Reservation truck-trails used by the Operator for log hauling to be surfaced and maintained by the Operator with cinders or other suitable material to a thickness of eight inches and width of sixteen feet.
4. Ponderosa Pine, Mexican White Pine and Douglas Fir be advertised at not less than \$3.55 per M and other species at not less than \$1.50 per M.

The foregoing resolution was made this 3rd day of July, 1944 and duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 1 (c), Article VI of the Constitution and by-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
