

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, it is desirable and to the interest of the tribe to continue water development program by the construction of water-storage tanks in dry and inaccessible section of the range within the reservation; with and through the cooperation of the AAA department, and

WHEREAS, the AAA program does not allow sufficient funds per yard in the construction of storage tanks in remote and inaccessible places without the assistance of tribal funds, and

WHEREAS, these tanks are great tribal assets.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Interior be requested to approve the expenditure of \$2,000 from the IIM funds on deposit to the credit of the tribe to assist the AAA department by absorbing as much as 25 per cent of the cost in some of the locations as agreed on between the AAA department and this Agency during the present fiscal year.

The foregoing resolution was this 3rd day of July, 1944 duly adopted by a vote of \_\_\_ for and \_\_\_ against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 1 (e) Article VI of the Constitution and By-Laws of the tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
