

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, The Representatives from the Bureau of Mines are now working on the Iron Deposit on Canyon Creek and will be there perhaps a year, excavating and drilling to determine the extent of the deposit on the Reservation and,
- WHEREAS, There is a real need for a road into this section of the Reservation for administration, range and stockwork purposes and,
- WHEREAS, The Bureau of Mines has agreed to pay one-half of the estimated cost; namely, \$1,500 in order that they may have the use of the road while prospecting the iron ore.
- BE IT NOW RESOLVED that the Tribe appropriate an equal amount from IIM Funds and that the Secretary of the Interior be requested to approve the expenditure of \$1,500 from IIM Funds now on deposit to the credit of the Tribe, and that the Agency build a road with Indian labor and equipment.

The foregoing Resolution was this 4th day of September, 1944 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d & e) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
