

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, The annual road budget because of the war has been very small and barely enough to keep the present road system in a passable condition which results in much of the road machinery being idle and the skeleton road crew laid off much of the time, and.

WHEREAS there is on the Cibecue hill on the main road west a very bad curve on which there have been some near accidents, especially driving on the down grade with cars and trucks and there is great danger of some being killed now.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Interior approve the expenditure of \$2,400 of tribal funds known as the I.I.M. Fund of the Fort Apache Indians for the purpose of filling across this dangerous place. That the Superintendent be directed to have the reservation engineer do this work with local Indian labor before the mountain road repair work because of climatic conditions in the higher elevations can be made.

The foregoing Resolution was on February 6, 1945 duly adopted 9 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI Section I (a) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the tribe, ratified by the tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
