

RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE
OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Whiting Brothers of Holbrook, Arizona, have requested advertisement for sale of the Walnut Canyon Unit, and, approximately ten million feet).

WHEREAS, the timber on the Walnut Canyon Unit is overmature with less exceeding growth; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this date, September 4, 1945, that the Walnut Canyon Timber Unit be advertised for sale to the highest bidder, provided that:

1. All species be advertised at not less than \$3.55 per M bd. ft.

The foregoing resolution was made this 4th day of September 1945 and duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 1 (c), Article VI of the Constitution and by-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, pursuant to Section 1f of the Act of June 18, 1934.
