

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this 4th day of September 1945 that because among the various stock associations our members that are very poor and have poor ranges and as a result, it is impossible for these men to pay their proportionate share to help work the cattle, also because of the many boys that are still in the army who have cattle and old people who have only a few, it is considered advisable and the Secretary is hereby requested to approve the expenditure of not to exceed \$3,000 from IIM Fund for the purpose of paying the necessary labor to assist in the working of the cattle for the above-mentioned members and such other expenditures that are necessary in connection with livestock work on this reservation.

The foregoing resolution was this 4th day of September 1945 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section I (d), Article 5 of the Constitution and By-Laws of the tribe, ratified by the tribe, ratified by the tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 in accordance with Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
