

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
PORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

Be it resolved by the council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this 5th day of November 1945 that,

WHEREAS, it is within the powers of the Tribal Council to submit to the Department of the Interior, recommendations for the expenditures of Gratuity and Tribal Funds for tribal support, reservation improvements, and other necessary activities looking towards the advancement of the reservation and its people, and

WHEREAS, there has been prepared an "Advance Estimate of Proposed Expenditures" for the fiscal year 1946 from tribal and gratuity funds which we have examined and the Superintendent has explained to us and which we have carefully considered in so far as it is possible to determine our requirements in advance,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Secretary approve the amount of \$28,530, P.L. Fort Apache Ind., Arizona, (Support) and \$14,000 Interest on P.L. Fort Apache Inds., Arizona, (Support) in connection with the other funds allotted and to be allotted for the fiscal year 1946 for similar purposes and including support of schools, hospitals Agency Administration, etc.

The foregoing resolution has this date been duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section I (c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the tribe, ratified by the tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1939 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
