

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, it is desirable and necessary in the necessary in the interest of increased food production to make an additional improvement to the various irrigation systems and pay for ditch riders to supervise the distribution of the water supply in order that all Indians may share equally in the limited amount of water available, and

WHEREAS, funds now available are barely sufficient to pay the irrigation supervisor during the present fiscal year,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Interior be requested to approve the expenditure of \$3,000.00 from IIM funds on deposit to the credit of the tribe to assist in the repairing and operation of the various small irrigation systems on the Fort Apache Reservation for the remainder of the present fiscal year.

The foregoing resolution was this 4th day of March, 1946 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 1 (c) Article VI of the Constitution and By-Laws of the tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
