

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Fall and Winter seasons of extremely low precipitation have resulted in unusually dry conditions on our range and forest lands with very hazardous forest fire conditions, and

WHEREAS, it is essential that funds be made available for the suppression of forest fires in order that we may protect our range and forest lands,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the white Mountain Apache tribe in regular session this 6th day of May, 1946 that \$1,500 ~~thousand~~ dollars be set aside from Tribal funds for the suppression of forest fires during the balance of the fiscal year 1946 and during the fiscal year 1947.

The foregoing resolution was, on May 6, 1946, duly adopted by a vote of for and against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 14, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 884).
