

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, as a result of extremely dry conditions on our forest and range lands there have occurred several forest fires which have been unusually difficult and costly to suppress, and

WHEREAS, labor, equipment hire and supplies, necessary for the suppression of these fires, are unpaid, and

WHEREAS, no gratuity funds are available for the payment of said labor, equipment hire and supplies,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this 3rd day of June 1946, that \$900 be set aside to pay for suppression costs now obligated and that an additional amount of \$3000 dollars be set aside to pay for the suppression of forest fires which may occur during the balance of fiscal year 1946 and during the fiscal year 1947.

The foregoing resolution was, on June 3, 1946 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to Authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (C) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
