

RESOLUTION OF THE  
 WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
 FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

Be it resolved by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that,

WHEREAS, the duties of the clerk, employed by the tribe, will hereafter include preparing loan applications, keeping complete records of loan advances and repayments and the necessary accounting in connection therewith and to keep records of livestock sales by cattle associations and handle necessary correspondence and records of the cattle associations in addition to the present duties in connection with the Tribal Buying and Selling Enterprise, now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the salary of the said Tribal Clerk shall be \$2050 per annum effective July 1, 1946 and there is hereby authorized the payment of the increased salary, and resolution 148 adopted May 6, 1946 is hereby amended to authorize the additional funds necessary.

The foregoing resolution was this first day of July, 1946, duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 1 (e) Article VI of the Constitution and By-Laws of the tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
