

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

Be it resolved by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this first day of July 1946, that

WHEREAS, many members of the tribe are indigent and have no means of support because of age, physical disability or other reasons, and

WHEREAS, the Council feels that tribal funds should be used to assist indigent members of the tribe and that such assistance should be in money rather than by rations, now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Council does hereby authorize the granting of assistance to indigent members of the tribe in accordance with the regulations attached hereto, and funds authorized for fiscal year 1947 by Resolution 148 are hereby authorized to be expended in accordance with the regulations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a committee consisting of three members of the tribal Council shall be appointed to consider applications for assistance and such committee is hereby authorized to approve or disapprove such applications as the particular case may justify.

The foregoing resolution was on July 1, 1946 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the tribal council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Act VI Section 1 (c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, approved by the tribe on August 15, 1938.
