

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Navopache Electric Cooperative (formerly the White Mountain Electric Cooperative) of Lakeside, Arizona, was authorized by Tribal Council Resolution No. 142 dated July 1, 1946 to survey for a proposed transmission line across a portion of the Fort Apache reservation, and

WHEREAS, the said survey has been completed and the Cooperative desires to obtain a right-of way for the construction, operation and maintenance of a transmission line across a portion of the Fort Apache Reservation, now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this 14th day of October 1948, a quorum being present, and maintenance of a transmission line across a portion Sections 9, 10, 14, 15, 23 and 24, Twp. 12 N., R. 23 E., and Section 19, T. 18 N., R. 24 E., all unsurveyed, within the Fort Apache Reservation is hereby approved, subject to the regulations pertaining to the granting of rights-of-way across Indian tribal lands, and upon payment of damages to growing timber in the amount of ninety Eight and 25/100 Dollars (\$98.25) in accordance with the attached schedule, said right-of-way to be not in excess of twenty (20) feet in width, and the granting of said right-of-way shall also grant the Navopache Electric Cooperative, its officers and employees, its successor and assigns the right of egress and ingress to said right-of-way, so long as said right of way easement shall be in effect and used exclusively for purposes set forth in the application.

The foregoing resolution was on October 14, 1948, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1(1) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on August 18, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
