

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE RESERVATION

WHEREAS, there are no jail facilities in the Cibecue community and there is need of such facilities to properly hold persons arrested by police and for confinement following sentence by the Tribal Court, now

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that \$1000 of Court funds now on deposit in an I.I.M. Account at the Fort Apache Agency be made available for the construction of a jail in the Cibecue community.

The foregoing Resolution was duly adopted on January 6, 1947, by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1(d) of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
