

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE RESERVATION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that in order to provide service to the members of the Tribe who do not speak or understand the English language, there is hereby authorized to be employed an interpreter to be available at the Agency Office during regular office hours to assist Indians in transacting business at the Agency. The Interpreter shall do such other work at the office building as directed by the Superintendent.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the salary of the Interpreter shall be \$75.00 per month and shall be paid from Tribal funds on deposit in an I.I.M. Account at the Fort Apache Agency.

The foregoing Resolution was duly adopted on January 6, 1947, by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1(d) of the constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
