

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, there are no facilities on the reservation for getting blacksmithing work done and,

WHEREAS, there is a continuing need for blacksmith services to be available for the Indians

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that an Indian blacksmith be employed continually at a salary of \$75.00 per month, said salary to be paid from Tribal Funds on deposit at the Fort Apache Agency, provided that all work done by said blacksmith shall be paid for by the party or activity requesting such work, and funds so received shall be deposited to the credit of the Tribe and shall be available for the purpose of purchasing supplies, materials and equipment required to operate said blacksmith shop and for payment of wages for the blacksmith and/or helpers as required.

The foregoing resolution was, on February 17, 1947, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 14, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat 984).
