

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the average value of ponderosa Pine lumber for the year 1946 reflected a substantial increase over its 1945 value,

AND WHEREAS the Commissioner of Indian Affairs has, as a result of increased lumber values, recommended that stumpage prices of all species on the Hop Canyon Unit be increased from \$3.65 per M. feet to \$4.15 per M. feet, as of May 1, 1947,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this date, March 3, 1947, that the recommendation by the Commissioner of Indian Affairs that stumpage prices for all species on the Hop Canyon Unit be increased from \$3.65 per M. feet to \$4.15 per M. feet as of May 1, 1947 be approved.

The foregoing resolution was, this 3rd day of March, 1947, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 1 (d), Article VI of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
