

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Southwest Lumber Mills, Inc., of McNary, Arizona has a timber contract on the Maverick Unit of the Fort Apache Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the contract on the Maverick Unit contains a clause requiring a minimum annual cut of five million feet, and

WHEREAS, the Southwest Lumber Mills, Inc., having failed to log on the Maverick Unit during the contract year ending March 31, 1947, has requested relief from cutting and paying requirements for that contract year

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this 7th day of April, 1947 that the request of the Southwest Lumber Mills, Inc. for relief from cutting and paying requirements of the Maverick Unit contract for the year ending March 31, 1947 be granted.

The foregoing resolution was on April 7, 1947 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
