

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

Be it resolved by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation in regular session this 9th day of June, 1947, that:

WHEREAS, the funds heretofore provided for elimination of worthless horses from the range have not been adequate for this fiscal year,

NO. THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED the sum of \$500.00 now on deposit in individual Indian money accounts to the credit of the Tribe, is hereby authorized to be used for the payment of wild horses removed from the range and turned over to the Williams Creek Fish Hatchery. Such funds as may be required to meet these obligations shall be taken from the funds received from the sale of fishing permits.

The foregoing resolution was duly adopted on June 9, 1947, by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d), of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 28, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 948).
