

RESOLUTION OF THE
 WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
 FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

Be it resolved by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation in regular session this 29th day of June, 1947, that,

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council feels that a Reservation Fair would be of great educational and social value to the people of the Reservation, and in order to make it possible for the Tribal Fair to be revived and Fair buildings to be repaired.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the amount of \$2,000.00 of Tribal Funds on deposit in individual Indian money accounts to the credit of the tribe is hereby authorized to be expended for Tribal Fair purposes for a Fair to be held in the fall of 1947. The funds hereby made available may be used for labor and materials, repairing existing Fair buildings and improvements, for premiums paid to exhibitors, for the hire of extra police and guards and other miscellaneous expenses that may occur in connection with the Fair.

The foregoing resolution was duly adopted on June 9, 1947, by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d), of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1948, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 13, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
