

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

Be it resolved by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that,

WHEREAS, it is desired to retain an adequate number of registered breeding cows in the I.D. Registered Herd, and

WHEREAS, at the present time there are not sufficient registered cows to properly maintain the purebred herd,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the purchase of 30 registered breeding cows from the Tal-wi-wi Ranch at the purchase price of \$400.00 each is hereby authorized. Payment of these cows to be made from funds received from the sale of I.D. Herd cattle at the 1947 sales, providing the 30 cows selected shall have the approval of the Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the Tribal Council, and that the purchase and care of these cattle shall be in accordance with the sale agreement made on September 23 between the White Mountain Apache Tribe and Dale Dunstead, owner of the Tal-wi-wi Ranch.

The foregoing resolution was duly adopted on October 9, 1947, by a vote of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d), of the Constitution and By-Laws of the tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
