


RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

Be it resolved by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that,  
WHEREAS, the State of Arizona has opened the wild turkey season for the  
period October 24 - 28, 1947, inclusive, and

WHEREAS, it has been our custom during past years to grant employees and  
local residents the privilege of hunting turkey on the Reserva-  
tion,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache  
Tribe in regular session this 9th day of October, 1947, that em-  
ployees and residents of the Reservation be issued permits to  
hunt wild turkey at a \$1.00 fee, provided; that all State laws  
pertaining to the hunting of wild turkey be complied with fully  
and that purchase of a State hunting license is prerequisite to  
issuance of a Reservation Permit, and provided further; that not  
to exceed 25 permits be issued to employees of the Southwest Lumber  
Mills, Incl, of McNary, Arizona.

The foregoing resolution was on October 9, 1947, duly adopted by a vote  
of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache  
Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (c), of the  
Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 16,  
1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pur-  
suant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
