

RESOLUTION  
of the  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE  
of the  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS there is need for legal counsel for the institution of claims against the United States pursuant to the Indian Claims Commission Act (Act of August 13, 1946, Public Law 726), now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this 5th. day of January, 1948, that James E. Curry, Attorney at Law, Washington, D. C. be employed to represent and advise the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, Arizona, in any and all claims of the tribe against the United States before the Indian Claims Commission; and that a contract setting forth the conditions and stipulations of said employment be drawn and approved subject to the approval of the Secretary of the Interior in accordance with Article VI, Section 1 (b) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution Number 233 was on January 5, 1948 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and none against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (b) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
