

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Considerable improvement is needed on the East Fork irrigation system and adjacent fields to provide for better use of irrigation water and better utilization of irrigated lands of the Indians which lie adjacent to the East Fork - Fort Apache irrigation ditch, and

WHEREAS, appropriated irrigation funds are not adequate to make the needed improvements, and

WHEREAS, it may be possible to obtain some funds under the Production and Marketing Administration of the Department of Agriculture commonly called the A.A.A. program, for this much needed improvement work, now

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this 2nd day of February, 1948, that there be hereby authorized and appropriated from tribal funds on deposit with the Fort Apache Indian Agency the sum of \$6000 for irrigation improvements in the East Fork - Fort Apache ditch with the provision that \$3000 shall be repaid from A.A.A. in 1948; provided that no part of the funds hereby made available shall be used until the projected work shall be approved by A.A.A.; and provided further that in the event A.A.A. shall approve an amount less than \$3000 that tribal funds shall only be used in amount equal to that which shall be contributed by A.A.A., unless additional amounts shall be specifically authorized by the Council.

The foregoing resolution was duly adopted on February 2, 1948, by a vote of 9 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1(d), of the Constitution and By-Laws of the tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
