

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, The Production and Marketing Administration of the Department of Agriculture, commonly called the A.A.A., has tentatively allocated the sum of \$8000 for so-called A.A.A. work on the Fort Apache Reservation for 1948, and

WHEREAS, the Council believes that certain range improvements, irrigation system improvements and improvements to farm land are needed and worthwhile and may be accomplished with the aid of A.A.A. funds, now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache tribe in regular session this 2nd day of February, 1948, that in order to receive the greatest benefits from A.A.A. during 1948 that such funds as are allocated by A.A.A. for projects on the Fort Apache Reservation for 1948 shall be matched with equal amounts of tribal funds on deposit with the Fort Apache Agency, and such funds not to exceed \$8000 are hereby authorized and appropriated to be used on projects approved by A.A.A., provided such projects are also approved by the Tribal Council and/or the Officers of the cattle association of the district in which the project is to be carried out.

The foregoing resolution was on February 2nd, 1948, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d), of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 28, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
