

RESOLUTION
of the
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE
of the
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Whiting Brothers of Holbrook, Arizona, as Purchaser, has a timber contract on the Hop Canyon Unit of the Fort Apache Reservation,

AND WHEREAS, the Commissioner of Indian Affairs has, in view of increased lumber values, informed the Whiting Brothers of his intention to increase the stumpage price on the Hop Canyon Unit from \$4.15 to \$5.80 per M, effective May 1, 1948,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this 1st day of March, 1948 that the said increase in stumpage price on the Hop Canyon Unit be approved.

The foregoing resolution was on March 1, 1948 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
