

RESOLUTION OF THE
 WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
 FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the two fires of June 16 - 18, north of McNary, burned over approximately 2,000 acres of cut-over-land and killed approximately three million feet of Ponderosa pine,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED By the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this 12th day of July, 1948, that the timber killed by the said McNary fires be advertised for sale at not less than \$5.00 per M feet and sold to the highest bidder.

The foregoing resolution was on July 12, 1948 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
