

RESOLUTION
of the
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE
of the
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Reservation that,

SINCE the majority of families living in the Cedar Creek community who have children in Cedar Creek School have their permanent homes at distances from two to five miles from the school, it is recommended that the Education Division seriously consider the providing of a school bus and driver for the Cedar Creek School in order that families having small children in the school can live in their permanent homes throughout the school year.

The foregoing resolution was duly adopted on the 1st day of November, 1948, by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1(e) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 934).
