

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the employment of forest fire lookouts are of primary importance in the protection of our valuable forest and grazing lands from fire, and

WHEREAS, the allotment of money to the fund "Management of Indian Forest and Range Resources" has not been sufficient to pay for employment of forest fire lookouts,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this 7th day of March, 1949 that Tribal funds in the amount of \$2,500.00 be set aside for the purpose of lookout employment and purchase of materials and supplies in connection with lookouts; said money to be used throughout the balance of the fiscal year 1949 and thereafter until it is depleted.

The foregoing resolution was on March 7, 1949 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1(e) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 884).
