

RESOLUTION OF THE
 WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
 FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation in regular session this 6th day of December, 1949 that,

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has no objection to the church known as the Latter Day Saints of the Church of Jesus Christ (Mormon) constructing a small mission chapel located on lands included in the Fort Apache School Reserve described as follows:

Originating a survey at the center corner of Section 34 & 35, Township 5 north, Range 23 East of the Gila and Salt River Principal Meridian, State of Arizona, County of Navajo, and extending 324.0 ft. South 77° 06' East to the Point of beginning, thence 200.0 feet North 31° 45' East to a point, thence 100.0 feet North 58° 15' East to a point, thence 200.0 feet South 31° 45' West to a point thence 100.0 ft. South 58° 15' East to the point of beginning closing the survey and enclosing an area of 0.459 acres.

The foregoing Resolution was on December 6, 1949 duly adopted by a vote of _____ for and _____ against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
