

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
LOFT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

No. 286

WHEREAS, the future source of timber for the Agency sawmill, the East-Fork drainage area has not been cruised or covered by a management plan, and

WHEREAS, development of the timber within the East-Fork drainage cannot be initiated until that area has been cruised and a management plan covering it has been developed,

AND THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this 7th day of March, 1949, that Tribal funds in the amount of \$4,500 be provided for the purpose of cruising the timber on the East-Fork drainage area and developing a management plan covering the said area, and

AND IT FURTHER BE RESOLVED that any balance remaining in the \$20,000 Tribal fund provided in 1947, for development of a Management Plan covering the Carrise Working Circle, be made available for use in development of a management plan for the East-Fork drainage area timber.

The foregoing resolution was on March 7, 1949 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1(c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 15 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
