

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation in regular session this 6th day of March, 1950, that,

WHEREAS, Norbert Josay, who completed Barber Training Course, has requested a loan from the Tribe, for the construction of a small Barber Shop, is not advisable, that,

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council feels that a Barber Shop is considered necessary and hereby authorize that such a building be constructed and equipped by the Tribe, to be rented to Norbert Josay, and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the expenditures of \$1500 from tribal funds on deposit in an Individual Indian Money Account with Fort Apache Indian Agency be hereby authorized for the construction and equipping of such a building.

The foregoing Resolution was on the 6th day of March duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
