

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FOOT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Heath and Fuller, of Young, Arizona have made application for advertisement and sale of approximately 2 1/2 million feet of timber adjacent to the west boundary of the Reservation and contained within Lost Tank Canyon, and

WHEREAS, this isolated and small island of timber is ripe for cutting and might be difficult to dispose of except to Heath and Fuller, whose mill is advantageously located to develop it,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this 6th day of March, 1980 that the timber in Lost Tank Canyon be advertised at a minimum price of \$6.25 per M and sold to the highest bidder, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council approve payment of timber, if contract for sale be consummated, based on gross tree scale, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and Secretary of the White Mountain Apache Tribe are hereby authorized to sign for and in behalf of the said Tribe a contract covering sale of the timber in Lost Tank Canyon.

The foregoing resolution was on March 6, 1980 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1(e) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 16, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1958 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
